Vallelunga (Rome), May 15

There will be more than 25 female riders fighting for podium this Sunday May 15, on the Vallelunga circuit (Rome), site of the first European Women's Cup.

The challenge for the first race (3 are scheduled in total) speaks French and Italian, with a hint of Hungarian. While other brave riders (German, Spanish and English) are training in the meantime for the upcoming races in Rijeka (Croatia) and Schleiz (Germany).

The female speed scenario in Europe blooms and shows off as fully grown-up and self standing. Sprouting from the experience and knowledge sowed in Italy (with the 2004 and 2005 edition of "Trofeo Italiano Motocicliste") and in France (with the come-back of Dream cup in 2004, 10 years after the "Trophée Féminin de Vitesse").

No borderlines for this bouquet of racers, girls and ladies coming from different countries and battling on the same circuit for the title of Best European Female Racer.
